<u>Detroit Lions Alumnus, Herman Moore supports</u> Trees for Troops in Michigan

Detroit Lions Alumnus, Herman Moore, will be joining the owners of Candy Cane CHRISTmas Tree Farm as they load 100 farm-grown Christmas Trees to U.S. troops and military families through Trees for Troops®, a nationwide program of the Christmas SPIRIT Foundation in conjunction with the National Christmas Tree Association, the Michigan Christmas Tree Association and FedEx.

Herman Moore and Best Drug Rehabilitation will be presenting a \$6,000 donation to support the Trees for Troops program. Moore will also join community and local retired military volunteers in loading the trees on the FedEx trailer on December 10th following a 10 am press conference at Candy Cane Christmas Tree Farm, 4780 Seymour Lake Rd. in Oxford. The trees will then depart for Cannon Air Force Base in New Mexico to help the troops and their families celebrate the Christmas season.

"Although all the trees are donated by growers and Fed Ex donates all of the shipping, there is still an estimated \$5 per tree cost to execute the Trees for Troops program," comments Marsha Gray, Executive Director of the Michigan Christmas Tree Association. "Mr. Moore and Best Drug Rehab stepped up with a very generous \$6,000 donation that covers the cost of all of our Michigan trees. We are very grateful for this type of support."

Statewide, Michigan's Christmas tree growers are donating more than 1,200 trees this year. Last holiday season, nearly 19,000 trees were delivered to 65 military bases in the U.S. and overseas. This brought the total to more than 122,000 Real Christmas Trees delivered through Trees for Troops since 2005.

"Being involved with Trees for Troops is truly a gift that gives back," said Nigel Manley, Christmas SPIRIT Foundation chairman. "It's rewarding and meaningful to everyone involved, because it gives us the opportunity to say thank you to our troops, and help ensure military families have the kind of joyful, traditional Christmas memories that we would wish for America's heroes."

Each year, hundreds of military families visit the Trees for Troops website and Facebook page to leave heartfelt thank you messages and pictures of their families celebrating around their beautifully decorated Christmas Trees. For example, a message from the Pendleton family read, "Thank you for our beautiful Christmas tree! We weren't sure what we were going to do this year...Trees for Troops was an answer to our prayers."
